LAUNCHING OF 1ST QUARTERLY **NATIONAL ACCOUNTS MEETINGS** 107TH NAC MEETING HELD ON 28TH **NOVEMBER, 2023**

Proceedings of 107th NAC meeting under the chairmanship of Secretary Planning, Development and Special Initiatives were held on 28th November, 2023 in the Auditorium of Ministry of Planning Development and Special Initiatives, Islamabad. The meeting was attended by representatives of various stakeholders, i.e., M/O Finance, PD&SI, Federal, and Provincial Organizations. Some participants attended the meeting



online.

According to IMF Data Quality Assessment Framework (DQAF) quarterly GDP estimates should be disseminated within three months after the end of reference quarter under the Special Data Dissemination Standards (SDDS). However, PBS was asked to compile and disseminate the QNA within 60 days after the end of reference quarter which was very challenging,

especially in the context that PBS has to compile ONA on the basis of indicators received from provincial departments and line ministries. Second challenge was the compilation of revised annual estimates for 2023 which are usually compiled in the month of "May" every year, however, under SBA, PBS has been asked to squeeze this lag by 06 months. Foreseeing the importance of QNA, PBS initiated the work on QNA soon after the approval of new

base of national accounts adopted in February 2022. PBS held discussions with the WB for technical assistance on ONA. Online discussion mode



was finalized with Mr. Jose Pablo (WB Expert).

Technical meetings started on 22nd June, 2022, and thereafter a series of weekly meetings were held. All technical aspects such as application of Denton Technique and Tramoseats software, Identification of indicators (Output - Input Indicators), Estimation of work in progress for crops, Development of composite indicators for various industries and Development of volume, price and value indicators for each industry came under discussion. Dissemination Policy of Quarterly National Accounts estimates

was also shared during the 107th NAC meeting which has been designed by following the IMF Data Quality Assessment Framework (DQAF) for National Accounts Statistics. According to the DQAF "the Quarterly GDP estimates are disseminated within three months after the end of reference quarter. It was also decided in the meetings that Press release for each gugrter including data for last 2-3 years supported by graphs will







DATA USERS AND DATA PRODUCERS DIALOGUE WORKSHOPS

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) in collaboration with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) organized four workshops titled 'Data Users and Data Producers dialogue' at Lahore, Karachi, Islamabad, and Peshawar The importance of data has been increasing day by day for policy planning and to start a rationale decision-making process in the broader context for individual, organization or at national & international level. PBS as National Statistics Organization of Pakistan is mandated to produce reliable Statistics for evidence based policy planning. For dissemination of reliable statistics, a national Data Dissemination Policy is being formulated. To enhance data accessibility to users for informed decision making, Pakistan Bureau of Statistics has started nationwide series of dialogue workshops between data users and data producers (including Provincial Bureaus, Crop Reporting and other Government Organizations) at national and provincial levels in collaboration with UNFPA. The workshops will be helpful in identifying the requirements of data users, finding gaps and improve data dissemination system.

FIRST WORKSHOP

The first workshop of the series was held on 20th November, 2023 at Lahore. The workshop was attended by data users, researchers, demographers and other stakeholders. Member (SS/RM), Muhammad Sarwar Gondal, Member (C & S) Avaz ud din and other senior officers of PBS welcome the distinguished guests.

Member (SS/RM), Muhammad Sarwar Gondal, presented the vision of PBS regarding Data Dissemination and apprised the forum that keeping in view the emerging needs of Data users and challenges faced in accessibility of required data, PBS has taken the initiative to host nationwide workshops.

Member (C & S) Ayaz ud din highlighted that these workshops will not only devise strategies for web-based data dissemination but will provide partners for data dissemination. Hence,

a mechanism for systematic feedback on data dissemination will be formulated in Pakistan. While interacting with data users key challenges in Census data accessibility can be discussed. The easily accessed data is helpful in quick decision making.

Dr. Luay, UNFPA Country Representative, emphasized the significance of sharing and disseminating data with the public. Acknowledging the transformative power of data for positive change and sustainable development, Dr. Luay highlighted the importance of making some percentage of anonymous micro-level data accessible. Such data serves as a crucial resource for in-depth research, enabling the estimation of various indicators at lower geographical levels. This approach empowers policymakers to tailor interventions and policies to specific local needs, ensuring a more targeted and effective impact on communities.

The participants showed keen interest in the workshop. They discussed the issues related to the subject, provided their valuable feedbacks to improve the system and anticipated that this initiative will strengthen the collaboration between data producers and data users.

Five groups comprising of participants of the workshop, having versatile background constituted for deliberation and formulate theirs recommendations on the following thematic areas of the workshop: Emerging user needs and data requirements, Challenges in data dissemination and accessibility, Strategies for web-based data dissemination, Partnerships for data dissemination, Mechanism for systemic feedback on data dissemination in Pakistan. All groups presented their suggestions and recommendation relating to the thematic areas.

This workshop will help to strengthen statistical production process, foster trust and mutual understanding between data producers and users. The workshop will help to formulate effective and vibrant national data dissemination policy to facilitate evidence based decision making, effective policy planning by ensuring easy access to the updated statistics for the prosperity of the nation.

Islamabad 7[™] December, 2023: Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) in collaboration with UNFPA Pakistan hosted a Dialogue Workshop between Data Users and Data Producers at Ramada Hotel, Islamabad. The workshop was attended by Stakeholders and Development partners from Islamabad, AJK and GB i.e., Public organizations, relevant Ministries, HEC, researchers, data users and representatives from International Organizations etc. The participation of all stakeholders helped in gathering diverse perspectives, identifying needs, and addressing any existing gaps in the data dissemination process. Chief Statistician, Dr Naeem uz Zafar (SI), Member SS/RM Muhammad Sarwar Gondal (SI), Member C & S, Mr. Ayazuddin, Member NA, Syed Ejaz Wasti and senior officers from PBS and representative from UNFPA were also present at the occasion. The keynote speeches and events included welcoming remarks by Ms. Rabia Awan, DDG, comments of UNFPA representative, Dr. Luay Shabaneh, brief on PBS vision on Data Dissemination by Dr. Naeem uz Zafar (SI), Chief Statistician, PBS, presentation on Data Dissemination by an International Expert, Mr. Sufyan Abu Harb. Group discussion on thematic areas and solution of issues defined in group discussion session and concluding remarks by Secretary PD & SI, Mr. Awais Manzoor Sumra . Dr. Naeem uz Zafar, (SI), Chief Statistician set the context by presenting history and functions of PBS by focusing on the First ever Digital Census, shared his thoughts on engagement of data users and producers for Data Dissemination Policy, and threw light on importance of their input on how to make data more useful, current modes of data dissemination were also part of presentation and he anticipated that with the collaboration of stakeholder Data Dissemination system can be improved. Mr. Sufyan Abu Harab from Palestine, Central Bureau of Statistics presented Data Dissemination strategies in an interactive way and stressed on disseminating the data according to needs of users. Statistical office should be proactive about data user demands and Data dissemination can become attractive for different categories of data users.

Secretary, PD & SI, Mr. Awais Manzoor Sumra in his concluding remarks appreciated PBS for completion of first ever Digital Census and anticipated that the workshop would be able to identify the emerging user needs and data requirements and the challenges faced by both data producers and user. Ms. Rabia Awan, Deputy Director General, PBS has attended the workshop on Population Projection The workshops was planned/ designed into two sessions daily at morning and afternoon, for learning and best understanding of the audience, every day session were consist of:-

- Lectures and demonstrations

- Participant presentations

Participants has prepared and presented their country presentation. Ms. Rabia has also presented the country presentation on Population Projection.

Workshop is targeted at countries which expressed a specific interest in learning more about population projections or for which population projections will soon become an important area of work. As Pakistan has conducted his first ever digital Census in this regard the workshop provides the vide range of experience on the subject, further sharing of experience by the other countries is also beneficial in finalization of census activities as well as in future.

OBJECTIVES OF WORKSHOP:

The main objective of the workshop is to strengthen the capabilities of National Statistical Organizations and other National Institutions involved in conducting and interpreting population projections. The specific objectives of the workshop are as follows: -

To provide participants with a clear understanding of available population projections methodology related challenges. and



- To discuss outputs of different projection exercises based on different methodologies and assumptions.
- To train participants on how to develop sets of assumptions for population projections and interpret results. To present selected tools for population projections.
- To share practical country experiences around various aspects of population projections

She informed the participants that it is essential that data may be critically reviewed and analyzed properly for effective decision making.

MEETING ON HIES 2024-25 SURVEY

A meeting on conduct of HIES 2024-25 surveyunder the chairmanship of worthy Chief Statistician was held on (HIES) Ms.Rabia Awan presented the prepatory work on upcoming HIES survey so far. She explained that PBS halted all survey activities including HIES 2021-22 due to conduct of 7th Population & Housing Census and staff was involved in gigantic activity of population & Hous-



ing Census which is the first ever "Digital Census" of Pakistan. Now the activities of Census have been completed successfully therefore PBS is planned to conduct their routine activities as per plane.

HIES survey has been planned to be conducted in 2024-25, therefore, preparatory working is in process for conduct of HIES 2024-25 survey. Technical committee for reviewing the PSLM/ HIES questionnaire, which was constituted in 2015-16, is re-constituted to review the HIES questionnaire for reducing/revising shortcomings, keeping in view the changed ground realities. Initial review of questionnaire has been completed and will be provide to technical committee for further input. Side by side Edit Checks and working on Manual of Instruction is also in progress.







FOCAL PERSON MEETING ON AGRICULTUR-**AL CENSUS (INTEGRATED DIGITAL COUNT)**

20-DEC-23

After the successful conduct of 7th Population and Housing Census, which was the biggest digital data collection exercise of South Asia, Pakistan Bureau of Statistics is going to conduct 7th Agricultural Census throughout the country. Agricultural Census is important for Evidence bases Policy making in agriculture and livestock sectors of economy. In 2016 activities for Agricultural census were started. However, these were halted due to urgent conduct of 2017 Population census. After 6th Population and Housing Census, in 2020 Mouza Census was conducted to update the frame of Agricultural Census as 7th Agricultural Census was planned in 2022. But due to the activates of 7th Population and Housing Census the Agricultural census activities were once again halted. 7th Agricultural Census will be the biggest exercise after P&H Census. Considering the Best Practices and recommendations of World Census of Agriculture (WCA) Programme by the UNFAO. WCA-2020 recommends to collect data of agricultural lands, crops, orchards, irrigation, livestock population, modern farming practices in one go through Agricultural Census. Therefore Governing Council of PBS decided in 2015 to merge the three past agriculture related censuses to save the time, cost, and resources.

· Six Agricultural Censuses

1972 > 1980 > 1990

· Five Agricultural Machinery Censuses

1984

· Four Livestock Censuses

1986 1996

Series of meetings were conducted to finalize Planning and Preparatory work of 7th Agriculture Census. An orientation session of nominated Federal and Provincial focal person was held on 20th December 2023 at National Census Coordination Centre (N3C), PBS Head Office, under the chair of Chief Census Commissioner, Dr. Naeem uz Zafar (SI). The main purpose of



meeting was to discuss the modalities and way forward for successful completion of this important exercise. Meeting was attended by, senior officers of Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, focal person from Federal and Provincial Governments (from board of revenue, Land Utilization and Agriculture Department) and provincial in charges.

The Chief Census Commissioner inaugurated the forum to commence discussions on the 7th Agricultural Census. Mr. Ayazuddin, Member (Census & Surveys), delivered the opening remarks, outlining the purpose of the meeting, which aimed to elucidate the roles and responsibilities at both the federal and provincial levels.



Subsequently, Mr. Muhammad Sarwar Gondal, Member (Statistical Support and Resource Management), provided a brief overview of the meeting's objectives. He shared his perspective on how the 7th Agricultural Census would be conducted through collaborative efforts between the federal and provincial governments.Dr. Amjad Javaid Sandhu, Director General (Administration), delivered an extensive presentation on the 7th agricultural census.







SERIES OF PROGRESS REVIEW MEET-INGS WERE HELD DURING OCT-DE-**CEMBER 2023 AND SO FAR COMPLET-ED ACTIVITIES:**

- Mouza Census has been completed in 2020 during challenging COVID days
- Rural Statistics have been completely collected showing Community level development indicators and facilities available for farming community (as per WCA 2020)
- Mouza selection from updated frame has been completed
- Trainings on Integration of Agriculture, Livestock and Machinery Censuses has been imparted by international consultant to PBS Technical Team

- Form-1 and Form-2 have been designed by merger of three questionnaires after consultation with Federal and Provincial stakeholders including FAO
- Tabulation plan has been devised (48+26+24=98 tables)
- Specifications for software development are under implementation by IT team
- Consultative meetings were convened with Federal Ministries, Provincial Departments and international agencies i.e. FAO, UNDP etc. for preparations of 7th Agricultural Census has been initiated.







"THE INTERNATIONAL FORUM ON DIG-ITAL FIRST APPROACH FOR THE PREPA-RATION OF THE THAILAND POPULATION **AND HOUSING CENSUS"**

Pakistan had successfully conducted and completed the gigantic activity of 7th Population & Housing Census 2023, "The First Ever Digital Census" throughout the country in the challenging timelines of 18 months. The exercise is biggest digital exercise of the South Asia covering around 250 million population with geotagging of 40 million structures. Thailand National Statistical office (TNSO) is preparing for conduct of Digital Census in 2025, accordingly for efficient planning and to learn from the knowledge and experiences of the other countries, TNSO with the collaboration of UNF-PA arranged International Forum on "Digital First Approach" w.e.f. 8-10 November 2023 in Bangkok Thailand. Pakistan Bureau of Statistics was also invited to share their experiences based on the successful recent execution of the Digital Census along with delegates from Australia, Malaysia, Korea, United Kingdom and US Census Bureau, Pakistan and Australia attended the meeting Physically and covered the major subjects in three days while remaining countries attended virtually and presented in one each specific topic. INFLATION SITUATION DURING (OCTOBER - DECEMBER, 2023)

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics is the National Statistical Office, responsible for collection, compilation and dissemination of Wholesale & Retail prices and indices to measure inflation in the country. National Consumer Price Index (NCPI), Urban Consumer Price Index (UCPI), Rural Consumer Price Index (RPI) and Wholesale Price Index (WPI) are computed regularly on monthly and Sensitive Price Indicator (SPI) on weekly basis. The monthly review on price indices and report on weekly SPI are also published on PBS official website http://www.pbs.gov.pk.

The monthly inflationary situation in Pakistan during October - December, 2023 is given in Table-1, the Core Inflation in Table-2, quarterly inflationary situation in Table-3 and cumulative indices are given in Table-3 below.

Table-1 gives the snapshot of yearly (YoY) and monthly inflation rates (MoM) for General, Food and Non-Food Groups at National, Urban & Rural domains along with SPI and WPI.



































EXTERNAL TRADE STATISTICS

EXPORTS FROM PAKISTAN

According to the provisional figures compiled by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, exports from Pakistan during November, 2023 amounted to Rs.734,541 million (provisional) as against Rs. 754,073 million in October, 2023 and Rs. 531,001 million during November, 2022 showing a decrease of 2.59% over October, 2023 and but increased by 38.33% over November, 2022.Exports during July - November, 2023 FY2023-24 totaled Rs. 3,502,147 million (provisional) as against Rs.2,660,653 million during the corresponding period of last year showing an increase of 31.63%.

Imports into Pakistan during November, 2023 amounted to Rs. 1,295,968 million (provisional) as against Rs. 1,363,574 million in October, 2023 and Rs. 1,145,885 million during November, 2022 showing a decrease of 4.96% over October, 2023 but increased by 13.10% over November, 2022.

Imports during July – November, 2023 FY2023-24 totaled Rs. 6,220,305 million (provisional) as against Rs. 5,806,628 million during the cor-

responding period of lasT year showing an increase of 7.12%.
